Founded in 1995, ESKA Norfolk is a leading martial arts organisation that delivers inclusive, high-quality karate and fitness-based programmes to children, adults and families.

It operates across multiple venues countywide and is headquartered in Norwich.

With three full-time and 12 part-time team members, ESKA blends elite coaching (with several world and European champions on board) with grassroots delivery.

It has evolved from a traditional karate club into a community-first wellbeing provider with a focus on physical activity, youth development and accessible health programming.

ESKA's programmes cater to a wide range of needs, including neurodiverse children, those with disabilities, young leaders and families facing disadvantage.

It is also part of the Short Breaks Framework, which provides support for children with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) and their families.

ESKA's delivery spans free school tasters, holiday activity and food sessions, SEN-specific classes, fitness initiatives and community engagement. It also collaborates with schools, Active Norfolk, the NHS and local authorities to enhance wellbeing outcomes for its members and the wider community.
